Speakers

The Hon. Mr Justice Nicholas Blake QC, President of the Upper Tribunal Immigration and Asylum Chamber (UTIAC) since February 2010 and Judge of the Queen's Bench Division since 2007. Previously, as a barrister, Mr Justice Blake specialised in Human Rights, Public International law and Refugee law and brought a number of landmark cases to the Luxembourg and Strasbourg courts, including, *Sivakumaran, Vilvarajah, Chahal, Surinder Singh, Shah and Islam, Adan and Aitseguer, Baumbast, D v UK, Razgar, Huang, Januzi, Fornah*.

The Hon. Mr Justice Egbert Myjer, Judge, European Court of Human Rights, Strasbourg. Mr Justice Myjer is Professor of Human Rights at the Free University of Amsterdam since 2000 and has previously served as Deputy Prosecutor-General and Chief Advocate-General of the Court of Appeal, Amsterdam as well as Advocate General of the Court of Appeal, The Hague. Mr Justice Myjer has published extensively and is co-author of the Human Rights Manual for Prosecutors (2003).

Ms Gareth Peirce, Senior Partner at Birnberg Peirce and Partners. A leading defence lawyer and civil rights advocate, Ms Peirce has acted in a number of high-profile human rights cases and has appeared for the Guilford Four, the Birmingham Six, the families of the victims of the Marchioness river boat disaster and the family of Jean Charles de Menezes.
